

# The Glen Station Agents

1870 - 1934

- 1870-1871 **Irving J. Dunn** (1847-?)  
1870 listed as "Depot Master" in census (The Glen)  
1871 station agent at The Glen  
1872 probably starts at new Riverside station  
1887 left Riverside in March
- 1871-1878 unknown
- 1879-1881 **Philip A. Whitaker** (1851-c.1936)  
1870 laborer, living near The Glen  
1874 Station Agent at Stony Creek in November  
1879-1881 Station Agent at The Glen; paid \$45/month  
1884 brakeman on Adirondack Railway  
before 1895-after 1920 Conductor for D&H  
1899 forms partnership with Ford Towner to develop  
graphite mine between Thurman & The Glen  
1930 retired, living in Saratoga Springs
- 1882-1896 unknown
- c.1897-1902 **Orley Hazelton** (1862-1932)  
1897 station agent at The Glen (possibly in 2<sup>nd</sup> photo)  
1902 new agent at Riverside, April 3rd  
1903-1927 in pulpwood business and working as a clerk  
for various businesses in Warrensburg  
1928 collector for water bills in Warrensburg
- 1902-1912 **Hollis Irving Loveland** (1878-?)  
1900 telegraph oper. in Johnsbury; born in Wevertown  
1902-1912 station agent at The Glen  
1918 Station Agent at West Rutland, VT  
1920 same  
before 1927-1940 Supervisor of Evergreen Cemetery  
1941-1947 Senator from Rutland, VT
- 1913-1923 **Lewis M. Holland (Mack)** (1891-1942)  
1912 living in Corinth  
c.1913-c.1923 station agent at The Glen  
c.1924-1941 works at North Creek station  
1934-1942 station agent at North Creek
- c.1924-1929 **Irving Phillip Goodman** (1879-1964)  
1900 bartender in Thurman  
1910 telegraph operator in Thurman  
1910 Station Agent in South Corinth  
c.1915-1923 Station Agent at Stony Creek  
c.1924-1929 possible Agent at The Glen  
1933 Station Agent in Willsboro, NY



1932-c.1934 **Hugh O. Jones** (1899-1985)

1930 census listing as Station Agent (probably Thurman)

1932 transfers from Thurman to The Glen with the closing of Thurman station January 1<sup>st</sup>

1932 listed as Station & Freight Agent for The Glen

1934 probably agent until station closes

1940 Telegraph operator for D&H in Westport, NY

1985 died in Essex County

Station closes in 1934 and is removed.
